Call to Worship – I Corinthians 12:12-20, 27

¹² *Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ.*

¹³ *For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink.*

¹⁴ *Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many.*

¹⁵ *Now if the foot should say, “Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body,” it would not for that reason stop being part of the body.*

¹⁶ *And if the ear should say, “Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body,” it would not for that reason stop being part of the body.*

¹⁹ *If they were all one part, where would the body be?*

²⁰ *As it is, there are many parts, but one body.*

²⁷ *Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it.*

Message Title – *What Did Jesus Do? Putting Down Markers*

Scripture Reading – Luke 4:14-22

¹⁴ Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news about him spread through the whole countryside.

¹⁵ He was teaching in their synagogues, and everyone praised him.

¹⁶ He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. He stood up to read,

¹⁷ and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. Unrolling it, he found the place where it is written:

¹⁸ “The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free,

¹⁹ to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor.”

²⁰ Then he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant and sat down. The eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fastened on him.

²¹ He began by saying to them, "Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing."

²² All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his lips. "Isn't this Joseph's son?" they asked.
