One autumn day in 2006 14-year-old Hannah Salwen was on her way home from a sleepover when they stopped at a busy intersection near their home. On one side of the car was a homeless man was sitting in front of fence holding a cardboard sign. On the other side was a man in a black Mercedes convertible. Hannah said to her father, *if that man had a less nice car, that man there could have a meal*. Three nights later, at dinner, she suggested that the family sell their home, buy a smaller one, and give away the proceeds. That's exactly what they did – a \$2 million dollar home. Her mother also quit her job – with an annual salary of more than \$500,000, a pay cut of 95% – to become a teacher. The larger story of their journey is fascinating, but there assessment was that their family had been losing their soul. I think I remember Jesus saying something about that.
